EPIPHANY CHALK BLESSING

Take the blessed chalk and first write the initials of the Wise Men, connected with Crosses over the inside of your front door (on the lintel, if possible. Then write the year, breaking up the numbers and the year so that they fall on both sides of the initials.

It should look like this:

20 C+M+B 26

With "20" being the millennium and century the "C" standing for the first Wise Man, Casper, the "M" standing for Melchior, the "B" standing for Balthasar and the "26" standing for the decade and year
